CISDL Conditions of a Senior Legal Research Fellowship:

The Centre for International Sustainable Development Law (CISDL)

CISDL is an independent legal research centre which is based at, and has a close partnership with, the Faculty of Law of McGill University in Montreal, Canada. CISDL also enjoys strong partnerships with several inter-governmental agencies, and other research institutes and universities in developed and developing countries, and an excellent international network of mentors, advisors and collaborators. Overall activities of the CISDL are coordinated by our two Directors, and our ongoing work is organized into six main legal research programmes, managed by Lead Counsels based around the world, and supported by a small secretariat in Montreal. You will become a member of small community of sustainable development lawyers, as one of the very few Senior Legal Research Fellows that we are able to appoint each year. If you are selected, we will ask that you familiarize yourself immediately with the CISDL's mission, principles, objectives, annual research strategies, publications and research programme agendas, by consulting the documents online at www.cisdll.org.

Selection of a CISDL Senior Legal Research Fellow:

Senior Legal Research Fellow positions are normally four years in duration, and are awarded through a competitive selection process based on CISDL priorities and the candidates academic and professional qualifications. Senior research fellowships are renewable. Senior Research Fellows are not required to be based in Montreal, they can also be based in the country of a CISDL Lead Counsel, or in any other country, particularly where they hold other academic or judicial appointments.

Privileges of a CISDL Senior Legal Research Fellow:

A CISDL Senior Research Fellowship grants the selected fellow access to an academic work station at the McGill Law Faculty, computer access, library access, meeting space, research assistance and other privileges as resources permit. It also grants the Senior Research Fellow access to publishing opportunities, and the chance to lead or collaborate on independent research projects of their interests, in collaboration with other CISDL members, access to international meetings hosted by CISDL or their partners, and access to contracts that come up from time to time. CISDL will facilitate consultations with CISDL lead counsel, and will also grant Senior Research Fellows access to an extended network of international advisors, academics and legal experts in the area of international sustainable development law. No financial remuneration can be provided by CISDL for Senior Research Fellows at the present time, so Fellows have to obtain funds from elsewhere if their work is to be sponsored.

Contributions Expected from a CISDL Senior Legal Research Fellow:

The CISDL will expect a Senior Research Fellow to take part in the research and activities of the Centre. CISDL will also expect you to demonstrate respect for the mission, principles and objectives of the CISDL, including its policies and decision-making structure, and to promote the CISDL and their CISDL research collaboration within their own academic or judicial institution. In addition, a Senior Research Fellow should involve law and other students in their work where this is relevant and helpful to the Fellow's research interests, to acknowledge their fellowship in any communications or publications related to the work they undertake while based at the CISDL, and to undertake minimum cooperative obligations that are involved in sharing an office with other scholars and sustainable development lawyers.
